Subscription to Journals and Databases:



Regular Review and Update:


Our library committee conducts regular reviews to identify and acquire new and updated documents related to national education policies. This ensures that our collection remains current and comprehensive.


Procedure for Document Requests:

Faculty members involved in curriculum development regularly provide lists of essential readings and policy documents. The library ensures that these materials are acquired promptly to support the curriculum.


Case Study – Curriculum Update:




