


Guest Lectures:

Feedback and Suggestions:




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4. Support to Curriculum Delivery

Industry Visits and Internships:






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5. Student Mentoring


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6. Financial Contribution

Infrastructure Development:



Job Placement Assistance:


Through their professional networks, alumni help students secure job placements and internships. They offer valuable advice on resume building, interview preparation, and job search strategies.
